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The Neal-Webb House ca. 1904

Majestically perched on the Corner of North Main and Noble, this beautiful, old home can definitely still charm any passerby!!! Another 'favorite' of mine in our historic district (I have many, in case you can't tell!!), this large, two story framed house with a side gable roof and dominant front gable, was designed by Barrett & Thompson Architects of Raleigh, North Carolina.

Built in 1904 for a prominent dry goods merchant, W. Perry Neal (1860-1909), this home, as well as the entire 400 block, belonged to the Neal Family. Mrs. Annie P. (Neal) Hunting, daughter of W. Perry Neal, eventually sold the home to her cousin, Elizabeth Clifton Webb, back in 1965. While sold out of the Webb-Neal families some years ago, this home is still privately owned today. It has some lovely, established landscaping and a few outbuildings on the property which keep the home looking like it did back in the day!
